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The School

Mountain Lakes High School is a traditional high school thirty miles west of New York City in the residential suburb of Morris County, NJ. Mountain Lakes High School is accredited by the New Jersey Department of Education and is recognized locally and nationally as a premier educational institution. Mountain Lakes has consistently ranked as a top school district in New Jersey Monthly and U.S. News and World Report.

Calendar, Course Credit, and Class Periods

Mountain Lakes operates in a rotating drop block schedule. Most students are enrolled in up to seven courses at a time. In general, students take four to five core academic classes each year. Classes meet 54 minutes per day. Credit is awarded at the end of the course, 36 weeks for year-long courses and 18 weeks for semester courses. Full-year classes earn 5 credits and semester courses earn 2.5 credits. Each quarter of Physical Education/Health earns 1.25 credits.
