TESTING UPDATES:

More than 1800 four-year colleges and universities are test-optional for fall 2023 admission. Please be careful to read the fine print as some colleges may still require test scores for certain majors, and many schools still use test scores to determine merit scholarships and placement in an honors college. If you are unsure of whether or not you should submit test scores please ask your counselor or Mrs. Gregory, the College and Career Counselor. If you have not done so already, be sure to:

Start your college applications, fill out the required MLHS forms found on the MLHS website and sign up for College Rep visits on Naviance. Please do not hand in your Transcript Request Form to your counselor until the end of the month. The transcript request form must be handed to your counselor at least 3 weeks before your first college deadline. We are currently integrating Power School and Genesis so that your transcript is complete with all of your Mountain Lakes High School grades and senior classes.

College visits start Wednesday, September 14. College representatives have begun to sign up for visits at MLHS. You can view the list and register on Naviance (located under the Colleges tab > Research Colleges > College Visits). More schools are signing up each day, so be sure to check back frequently. You must either email or ask your teacher in person whether or not you can miss class for a college rep visit and arrange to make up any missed work, quiz or test.

QUESTIONS FOR COLLEGE REPS:

We are lucky to have many Admission Counselors schedule visits to MLHS. Throughout the visit, they'll likely ask if you have any questions. Make sure to have some prepared! Here are some suggestions:

 What kind of support do you have on campus? (i.e. counseling services, tutoring, career services)

- 2. What are the most popular student events / clubs on campus? What does an average weekend look like for students?
- 3. How would you describe the student body?
- 4. What are some unique programs or classes in your school's curriculum?
- 5. What's your average class size? What is your typical introductory class size?
- 6. How accessible are professors?
- 7. What opportunities are there for undergraduate research? In what year can you begin research?
- 8. What is the political climate on campus?
- 9. Do students need to apply to the school in general, or to a particular major? If it's the school in general, when do students need to declare a major?
- 10. Are there different admission requirements for any majors? (i.e. is precalculus needed to apply to the business school? Is a portfolio required for arts majors?)
- 11. What are you looking for in an applicant?

And, here are some questions NOT TO ASK:

How is your [insert major] program? Admission Counselors are never going to say that they have a *bad* program. Think of something a bit more specific to ask about the major you're considering.

Do you have [X] major? Look this up in advance.

Do you have internships / study abroad? Almost all colleges provide some type of opportunity for internships and study abroad. Think of something more specific, such as: "How does your Career Services Office help students find internships?"
